In that time an estimated one million Iraqis have died, nearly four thousand U.S. service members have died, and five million Iraqis have been displaced from their homes. Meanwhile the United States has spent nearly five hundred billion dollars just for the war in Iraq. That is money that could go to badly needed social programs at home. State budgets are being slashed, our national infrastructure is falling apart, and student fees are on the rise. In 2008-2009, student fees are expected to increase by ten percent in both the UC and CSU systems. Our government is attacking Iraq, and at the same time is attacking social spending at home, spending that helps poor people, communities of color, and students. **These are two sides of the same war. We must put an end to both.**

It is up to us. The past five years have also shown that the ruling elite, whether Democrat or Republican, have no interest in ending a war that has made their corporate backers rich.
